

Texas Legal Legends Event

Judge Mary Lou Robinson will be inducted as a Texas Legal Legend at noon on September 11, 2015 at the Texas Tech University School of Law.

Judge Robinson has served on the bench for sixty years, and was the first female appellate judge in Texas. She received her B.A. and LL.B. from the University of Texas. She was a State District Judge of the 108th district and a Justice on the Seventh Court of Civil Appeals in Amarillo, where she also served as Chief Justice. President Carter appointed her to the U. S. District Court for the Northern District in 1979.

Judge Robinson is a wonderful example of a Texas Legal Legend. Her entire legal career has been spent making a difference in the service of others.
